

AUGUST 2023




In August, BARC's live release rate improved significantly, jumping almost 6% to get back above the 70s. This was the first month since March that the shelter saw a live release rate in the 80 percentage range, totaling 83.2%. The summer months have been tough for BARC, particularly at the start of kitten season. With the start of the Fiscal Year, BARC began making changes as well to the amount of animals it kept on property, pushing to max capacity. This did result in an immediate improvement to the live release rate.

At this point in the calendar year, August's field intake numbers were only second to April, in terms of animals brought in by our enforcement team. BARC's total intake through August, for calendar year 2023, is also already more than 13,00 and is on pace to once again beat the previous year's numbers (BARC had a a total intake of 17,533 animals in calendar year 2022).





COMPARING THE DATA

Great news, Houston! BARC saw an improvement over July in all outcome areas. Once again, August only trailed behind April, this time when it came to foster numbers. There is a correlation, when looking at higher intake months, between the amount of animals brought in and the amount of animals transferred through foster. Our hopes for the future are to see these numbers remain high, no matter the intake.









SEPTEMBER 2023



September was another slight step back for BARC's live release rate, however, overall the number remained in the 80s, percentage-wise. This month, BARC started the first of several new pilot initiatives approved by Mayor Sylvester Turner in an attempt to improve the live release rate through the end of his administration and calendar year. This month, BARC began offering extended adoption hours to the public on Wednesdays and Thursday. Adopters, rescue groups, and fosters now have until 7 p.m. these nights to pick up animals from BARC.

Once again, field intake numbers were higher than the amount of animals brought into the shelter through "over the includes counter," which owners surrenders. BARC continues to follow a managed intake model, and the public is required to make an appointment for intake. Please note, BARC must accept any animal that is sick, injured, or fading.



COMPARING THE DATA

Adoption and rescue numbers are slightly down behind the previous month's numbers, but they remain relatively consistent with previous year's numbers (especially foster). September rescue numbers were aided by another quarterly rescue rally, wherein BARC offers up to \$200 for each dog that a rescue tags from our Urgent Pets list. This incentive helps some rescues take animals that they otherwise wouldn't be able to.
