

JULY 2023



July 1 marks the start of a new Fiscal Year in the City of Houston. While the Fiscal Year's Live Release rate was 81%, we started off the new year with a new low of 77.7%. In the past year, we saw a 48% increase in the amount of animals brought into the shelter by the enforcement team. At the same time, our rescue, adoptions, and foster numbers are not increasing. As the number of animals we intake annually increases, and the live outcome remains the same, the live release rate has ultimately decreased.

77.7% TOTAL SAVE RATE

Save Rate = The percentage of animals who leave the shelter through adoption, return to owner, transfers to other organizations, or other lifesaving program

July 2022 vs July 2023 is a great example of the shift in our intake. As we saw 7,000 more calls for service from the public in Fiscal Year 2023, our enforcement team has increased the amount of animals they've been bringing into the shelter. Intake between July 2022 and July 2023 was up by 8%, and the enforcement team's numbers alone were up by a significant 47.1%.


