Our Save Rate rose slightly in March. Adoptions dropped slightly, but remained relatively consistent thanks in part to the Pick Your Pet Adoption event, held in partnership with ABC13. This year's event once again offered \$13 adoption fees for all shelter pets and was extended to two days. A total of 111 animals found their forever homes! Intake also continues to rise, with almost 200 more animals entering the shelter this month. The biggest increase was cats, who almost doubled their intake numbers, marking the early signs of the 2023 kitten season.

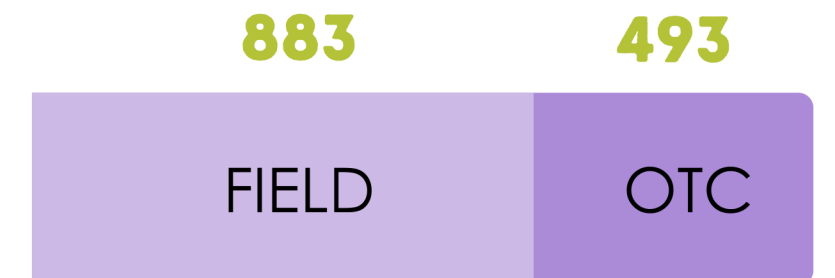

BARC's enforcement team continues to receive more calls for service month-by-month. It's not surprising to see, then, that our intake source is increasingly shifting to field. The number of animals brought in via field intake in March 2023 was nearly 43% higher than March 2022. Many of the animals brought in via the field are unsocialized, with limited human interaction and no experience in captivity.

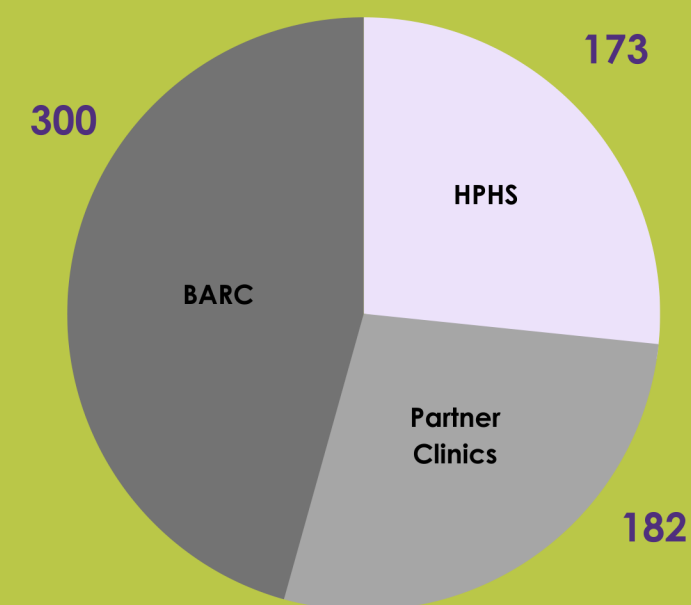

While more animals were outcomes via rescues in March than February in 2023, we're still seeing fewer rescue pulls than from 2022 (730 animals were outcomed to rescues in March last year). Foster pulls continue to rise in 2023, however, a hopeful sign post-pandemic as BARC has worked hard to rebuild the program.
