A regular meeting of the Houston City Council was held at 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, February 2, 2021 with Mayor Sylvester Turner presiding with Council Members Amy Peck, Tarsha Jackson, Abbie Kamin, Carolyn Evans-Shabazz, Dave Martin, Tiffany Thomas, Greg Travis, Karla Cisneros, Robert Gallegos, Edward Pollard, Martha Castex-Tatum, Mike Knox, David W. Robinson, Michael Kubosh, Letitia Plummer and Sallie Alcorn; Randy Zamora, Legal Department and Marta Crinejo, Agenda Director present.

At 1:50 p.m. Mayor Turner called the meeting to order and stated that we are one day closer to the delivery from Council Member Kamin, the City Council baby and we will begin today with a presentation by Council Member Thomas.

Council Member Thomas presented a proclamation to the Theta Chi Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. in appreciation for their tireless volunteer work with the District F Office during the COVID-19 Pandemic and Allen Lawrence accepted the proclamation.

No Members of Council had any comments or remarks on the Monthly Financial Report.

MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Turner stated that February 2nd the Houston Health Department has received a total of 41,951 doses of the COVID-19 vaccine and have administered 37,956 doses. The amount that they received they have been putting shots in the arms of about 90% of what we have received. The Health Department have also received a total of 19.102 second doses and have nearly administered 4,000 doses with a total amount of 11,971 second doses for the week. They are operating on two different tracks with the first dose and the second dose. Mayor Turner really wants to extend his appreciation to the Health Department because this is a big lift when they are administrating both of the COVID-19 doses and he wants to thank them for their efforts. The Houston Health Department is reaching out through text messages and emails and telephone calls to schedule the second doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. The messages contain a survey link for people to self-register for a second dose of the vaccination dose appointment and if a person doesn't receive a message to confirm their appointment 48 hours before the recommended 28 day due date, contact the Houston Health COVID-19 Call Center at (832)393-4220 and again they are asking people not to reach out to the Health Department unless you're within 48 hours of your scheduled time to get the second dose. Last week, they were in the Alief area and this Saturday they will be in another community in Northeast Houston to be much closer to the high risk vulnerable populations who want to be vaccinated and more information will be released targeting these communities. Speaking of this weekend, this is Super Bowl Sunday and he wants people to be mindful that this is not an opportunity to come together in large numbers. If you are going to be around people, make sure you wear your masking and social distancing. The numbers are slowly coming down and let's continue working together to bring the numbers down. Yesterday the Houston Health Department reported 499 cases of COVID-19, bringing Houston's total to 159,187 and sadly they have reported 7 more people have died as a result of this virus. The City of Houston has 1,791 families who have been permanently impacted through the loss of loved ones.

Mayor Turner stated that yesterday he joined Green Town Labs Houston for a ground breaking ceremony of the City's first ever Climate Tech startup Incubator Facility located in Houston's Innovation District and Green Town Labs happens to be the largest incubator in the North American Continent and they have expanded from the Boston area to the Houston area and the

incubator will provide more than 40,000 square feet of prototyping lab, office space and community space for about 50 startup community companies. The City of Houston announced this location at 4200 San Jacinto Street in the Innovation District, then developed by the Rice Management company. We can't wait to see the Green Town Labs incubator in within few months. Also, this week, the City of Houston joined BP and Uber to announce the partnership for the Planning and Deployment of BP's Rapid Electrical Vehicle Hubs. The groups will identify potential locations in Houston to support distribution of the charging Hubs with a focus on deploying a convenient and equitable network of charging stations that is available to the public. This is another way of Houston leading the way in energy transition.

With regards to the Houston Municipal Courts, once the pandemic ends and becomes safe to travel internationally, you can pick up your passport in the Houston Municipal Courts. The Houston Municipal Courts is now accepting passport applications and you can visit the website to download the passport application check list and schedule an appointment at the Houstontx.gov/courts.

February is Black History Month a time when we all can reflect on the contributions, the pains and successes made by African Americans throughout our Country. So, I wanted to highlight a recent announcement and commend Prairie View, Rice University, Texas Southern University and the University of Houston for joining together to create the Southeastern Texas African & African American studies consortium and he wants to thank all of the individuals and I think that it is tremendous milestone. Mayor Turner stated sadly James L. Conyers who he personally knew, one of the founding members of consortium died last month after leading the University of Houston's program and will not see his creation. On a lighter note The Dessert Gallery gave limited edition cookies Beyonce or Mayor Turner Astronaut Ronald McNair and Bessie Coleman the 1st Native American to hold a pilot's license. Today marks 1-year since the passing of City Secretary Anna Russell having served 65 plus years. She was a trooper bringing up 3 girls while continuing to work and not missing a beat.
