

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RECOMMENDATION: Conduct public hearing to determine whether to continue Juvenile Curfew Ordinance

Amount and Source of Funding: N/A

EXPLANATION:

State law requires cities that have adopted juvenile curfew ordinances to conduct hearings every three years to determine whether to continue or modify the curfew restrictions. City Council last acted to continue the current City of Houston Juvenile Curfew Ordinance in May 2007. Thus, the City's current Juvenile Curfew Ordinance must be continued prior to May 9, 2010 or it will expire as a matter of law. In accordance with state law, it is anticipated that two public hearings before the full City Council will be held. The first will held on April 14, 2008 and the second will be on April 21, 2010. It is anticipated that on April 21, 2010, in addition to the second public hearing, the ordinance that actually renews the Juvenile Curfew Ordinance will be presented to Council for consideration.

It should be noted that on April 8, 2010 a joint report on this issue was presented to the Public Safety and Homeland Security Committee by the Houston Police Department Juvenile Division and the Municipal Juvenile Court. At that time the Committee voted favorably to forward to full Council the scheduling of the Public Hearings and consideration of the ordinance to renew the Juvenile Curfew Ordinance.

Juvenile Curfew Ordinance Renewal Proposal 2010

2010 Curfew Ordinance Review

Introduction

On November 9, 1991, the city of Houston enacted a juvenile crime ordinance in response to growing concerns about trends of violent crime and gang activity involving juveniles and young adults. When enacting the curfew ordinance, City Council mandated that a review be conducted six months after passage of the ordinance in order to evaluate its effectiveness. The Juvenile Division of the Houston Police Department conducted that review in 1992, concluding that the curfew was accomplishing goals envisioned by City Council.

Effective May 31, 1995, Section 370.002 of the Texas Local Government Code required that municipalities review their curfew ordinances every three years.

- The first review mandated by the Local Government Code was conducted by the Juvenile Division in 1998, after which City Council continued the juvenile curfew by adopting Ordinance #98-366, effective May 19, 1998.
- After a second review in 2001, City Council again continued the juvenile ordinance curfew by adoption of Ordinance #01-409, effective May 15, 2001.
- A third review was conducted in 2004, after which City Council continued the juvenile curfew by adopting Ordinance #04-384, effective May 11, 2004.
- A fourth review, in which several changes were made to the existing ordinance, was conducted in 2007, after which City Council modified and continued the juvenile curfew by adopting Ordinance #07-563.

Under terms of Section 370.002, a new three-year review must be completed by May 11, 2010, in order to maintain the curfew as current law. The Houston Police Department has once again been delegated the task of evaluating the continued need for a juvenile curfew ordinance and developing a plan for the review process, including public hearings. Failure to perform this required review will result in the expiration of the Houston curfew ordinance.

The following study summarizes Texas law, Houston's curfew ordinance, the Houston Police Department's juvenile curfew enforcement guidelines, the curfew reviews of 1992, 1998, 2001, 2004, and 2007, Uniform Crime Report (UCR) Part One summaries for juvenile suspect and victim incidents, and other relevant information in order to determine the effectiveness of the curfew ordinance.

Texas State Law

Section 370.002, Local Government Code, **titled Review of Juvenile Curfew Order or Ordinance** requires a review of the local curfew ordinance every third year. It specifically states:

- Before the third anniversary of the date of adoption of a juvenile curfew ordinance by a general-law municipality or a home-rule municipality or an order of a county commissioners court, and every third year thereafter, the governing body of the general-law municipality or home-rule municipality or the commissioners court of the county shall:

- review the ordinance or order's effects on the community and on problems the ordinance or order was intended to remedy;
- conduct public hearings on the need to continue the ordinance or order; and
- abolish, continue, or modify the ordinance or order.

Failure to act in accordance with Subsections (a) (1)-(3) shall cause the ordinance or order to expire.

Houston Juvenile Curfew Ordinance

The city of Houston Juvenile Curfew Ordinance is found in the Code of Ordinances under Article V, Section 28-171, 28-172, 28-173, 28-174, and 28-175. This ordinance defines a minor as a person under seventeen (17) years of age. Section 28-172, *Offenses*, states:

Sec. 28-171. - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, unless the context of their usage clearly indicates another meaning:

Adult means an individual who has attained the age of 18.

Curfew hours means the period between the hours of 11:00 p.m. on any Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday and 6:00 a.m. of the following day, between the hours of 12:00 a.m. (midnight) and 6:00 a.m. on any Saturday or Sunday, or between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. on a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday.

Emergency means an unforeseen combination of circumstances or the resulting state that calls for immediate action. The term shall include but not be limited to a fire, natural disaster, vehicular accident, or a serious medical condition of sudden onset.

Guardian means the person who, under a court order, is the guardian of the person of a minor or the public or private agency with whom a minor has been placed by a court.

Minor means any person under 17 years of age.

Parent means the natural mother or father or adoptive mother or father of a minor.

Public place means any place to which the public or a substantial group of the public has access and includes, but is not limited to, streets, highways, and the common areas of schools, hospitals, apartments, office buildings, transport facilities, restaurants, theaters, game rooms, shops and shopping centers.

(Ord. No. 91-1543, § 2, 10-30-91; Ord. No. 07-563, § 3, 5-9-07)

Sec. 28-172. - Offenses.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any minor to knowingly remain, walk, run, stand, drive or ride about, in or upon any public place in the city during curfew hours.
- (b) It shall be unlawful for the parent or guardian having legal custody of a minor to knowingly allow or permit the minor to be in violation of the curfew imposed in section 28-172(a) of this Code.
- (c) Violations of this section shall be punishable as provided in section 1-6 of this Code.

(Ord. No. 91-1543, § 2, 10-30-91; Ord. No. 07-563, § 4, 5-9-07)

Sec. 28-173. - Defenses.

It is a defense to prosecution under section 28-172 of this Code that:

- (1) The minor was accompanied by his or her parent or guardian;
- (2) The minor was accompanied by an adult designated by his or her parent or guardian;
- (3) The minor was on an errand made necessary by an emergency;
- (4) The minor was attending a school, religious, or government-sponsored activity or was traveling to or from a school, religious, or government-sponsored activity;
- (5) The minor was engaged in a lawful employment activity or was going directly to or coming directly from lawful employment;
- (6) The minor was on the sidewalk directly in front of the place where he or she resides;
- (7) The minor was on an errand directed by his or her parent or guardian;
- (8) The minor was in a motor vehicle involved in intrastate or interstate transportation;
- (9) The minor was engaged in, participating in, or traveling to or from any event, function or activity for which the application of section 28-172 of this Code would contravene his or her rights protected by the Texas or United States Constitution;
- (10) The minor was married or had been married or had disabilities of minority removed in accordance with chapter 31 of the Texas Family Code;
- (11) With respect to the hours between 9:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m., the offense occurred during the school summer vacation break period of the school in which the minor

is enrolled or on a holiday observed by the closure of classes in the school in which the minor is enrolled or that the minor has graduated from high school or received a high school equivalency certificate;

- (12) With respect to the hours between 11:00 p.m. and 12:00 a.m. (midnight), the day following the offense is a holiday observed by the closure of classes in the school in which the minor is enrolled; or
- (13) The minor was attending or was traveling to or from a recreational activity supervised by adults and sponsored by the city, a civic organization, or another similar entity that takes responsibility for the minor.

(Ord. No. 91-1543, § 2, 10-30-91; Ord. No. 07-563, § 5, 5-9-07)

Sec. 28-174. - Supplemental effect.

The provisions of this article are supplemental and shall be cumulative with all other laws and ordinances applicable in any manner to juveniles.

(Ord. No. 91-1543, § 2, 10-30-91)

Sec. 28-175. - Enforcement.

Notwithstanding the penal effect of this article the chief of police is encouraged to develop alternative enforcement strategies, which may include but need not be limited to the return of minors to their residences or schools, counseling with minors and their parents or guardians, the issuance of warning citations to minors or their parents or guardians, or the referral of instances that appear to also involve the violation of school attendance laws to those officers who are responsible for the enforcement of those laws.

The enforcement strategies shall be promulgated in writing to members of the police department so that this article may be enforced in a uniform manner.

(Ord. No. 91-1543, § 2, 10-30-91)

In summary, the Houston Juvenile Curfew Ordinance includes both a daytime and nighttime curfew. It also includes a provision to cite parents having legal custody who knowingly allow or permit violations of the ordinance. The penalty for violation of curfew falls under Section 1-6, which provided for a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

Houston Police Department Juvenile Curfew Guidelines

On February 13, 1992, former Police Chief Elizabeth Watson issued Houston Police Department Circular #92-02113-1, titled Juvenile Curfew Guidelines. This circular provides background information, provisions of the ordinance, policy, and enforcement guidelines. Portions of this circular are discussed below.

The **Background** section states:

Houston City Council enacted a juvenile curfew ordinance effective November 9, 1991. The expressed purpose of the ordinance is to deter juvenile violence and gang activity, reduce crime committed by persons under the age of eighteen (*since changed to under the age of seventeen*), prevent victimization of minors and provide for the enforcement of parental control and responsibility for their children.

The **Policy** section states:

It is the policy of the Houston Police Department to utilize the juvenile curfew as a positive tool to accomplish the intents and purposes expressed in the Ordinance. Upon finding a minor in violation of the curfew, an officer may, at his/her discretion and, depending on the circumstances of the violation, issue appropriate citations. HOWEVER, in exercising his/her discretion, the officer should consider such factors as:

- the age of the minor
- the location where the minor was encountered (i.e., the nature of the place, proximity to the minor's residence, the presence of other persons)
- the time of day/night the minor was encountered in relation to the curfew hours; and
- whether returning the minor to his/her parents or to school or removing the minor from potentially or actually harmful surroundings would be more appropriate than taking the minor into custody or issuing a citation.

The emphasis in utilizing the Juvenile Curfew Ordinance is to:

- return the minor to his/her parent or guardian and gain parental support for proper supervision
- return the minor to school, if appropriate, where proper school administrative action can be taken by school officials
- remove the minor from potential or actual harmful circumstances

Under the section titled **Enforcement Guidelines**, it is important to note that citations may be issued to minors ages ten through sixteen. Minors so cited are required to attend

municipal court with at least one parent. Citations are not to be issued to minors younger than ten years of age.

1992 Study of Curfew Ordinance

On November 16, 1992, the Juvenile Division submitted a **Study of Effect of Curfew Ordinance** to former Police Chief Sam Nuchia. Three months in 1991, before the curfew ordinance was adopted, were selected for comparison to the same three months in 1992 after enforcement of the ordinance had commenced. The 1992 study determined that the victimization rate of juveniles increased almost 2% during the daytime curfew hours but decreased 21% during the nighttime hours. Simultaneously, there was a 15% increase in the victimization rate of persons ten through seventeen years-of-age during non-curfew hours. The number of juvenile suspects brought into the Juvenile Division increased 23% during the daytime curfew hours, but decreased 17% during the nighttime curfew hours. When the daytime and nighttime curfew hours were combined, the juvenile arrest rate decreased by 0.1%. This compared to a 12.6% increase during non-curfew hours.

1998 Study of Curfew Ordinance

The 1998 curfew study states that the number of citations issued for violations of the juvenile curfew ordinance rose steadily from 1992 (9359) to a peak in 1996 (14325). Little change was noted in 1997 (14168). By this time, Houston police officers were actively enforcing the curfew ordinance and a general decline in juvenile crime, juvenile victimization, and the number of juveniles processed by the Juvenile Division Intake

section were observed. Statistics regarding the ethnicity of those who received curfew citations indicated a strong correlation to the student demographics of the Houston Independent School District. Records for the Harris County Juvenile Probation Department revealed declines beginning in 1995 for:

- the number of youths charged
- the number of property crimes
- the number of crimes against persons, and
- the number of serious offenses of homicide, arson, sexual assault, felony assault, robbery, burglary, felony theft, auto theft, and felony drug offenses.

At the time of the 1998 review, no legal challenges had been attempted against the curfew ordinance, and public support seemed solid.

2001 Study of Curfew Ordinance

A study of the three years included in the 2001 Review of the Juvenile Curfew Ordinance (1998, 1999, and 2000) showed that juvenile crime and victimization rates had generally demonstrated steady decreases. Review of enforcement activity indicated that the ethnicity of juveniles cited for violation of the curfew ordinance closely paralleled the demographics of the Houston Independent School District. The number of citations issued for violations of the juvenile curfew ordinance, both daytime and nighttime, decreased during this period. This decrease is believed, by some, to be due to voluntary compliance resulting from aforementioned enforcement efforts. It is believed that enforcement of the juvenile curfew ordinance is one factor in the reduced levels of

juvenile crime and victimization experienced during the period covered in the 2001 review.

2004 Study of Curfew Ordinance

Study of the three years included in the 2004 Review of the Juvenile Curfew Ordinance (2001, 2002, and 2003) indicated declines for juvenile crime and victimization rates in Part I violent crimes following an increase from 2000-2001. Juvenile suspect Part I non-violent incidents also declined during this period. Review of enforcement activity indicated that the ethnicity of juveniles cited for violation of the curfew ordinance closely paralleled the demographics of the Houston Independent School District. The number of citations issued for violations of the juvenile curfew ordinance, both daytime and nighttime, increased during this period. It is believed that enforcement of the juvenile curfew ordinance is one factor in the reduced levels of juvenile crime and victimization.

2007 Study of Curfew Ordinance

A study of the three years included in the 2007 Review of the Juvenile Curfew Ordinance (2004, 2005, and 2006) indicate the number of juvenile curfew citations decreased 57.4%, from 2003 to 2005, an indication that trends rise and fall in response to crime problems, with crime patterns in three categories fluctuating in relationship to juvenile curfew enforcement. Review of enforcement activity indicated that the ethnicity of juveniles cited for violation of the curfew ordinance closely paralleled the demographics of the Houston Independent School District.

After the 2007 Review, the Juvenile Curfew Ordinance was amended as of May 9, 2007, defining the age of a minor as under 17 years old, and adding several defenses to the code (see pages 3-7).

2010 Study of Juvenile Curfew Ordinance

A study of the three years included in the 2010 Review of the Juvenile Curfew Ordinance (2007, 2008, and 2009) indicate the number of juvenile curfew citations decreased from 2007 to 2009 by 33.7%. Total Juvenile Curfew citations, as reported by the City of Houston Municipal Courts are as follows:

- 2007 – 3617 citations issued
- 2008 – 3069 citations issued
- 2009 – 2398 citations issued

A review of the Juvenile Intake sections juvenile processing numbers for the same period shows a similar, although smaller reduction of 5.47%:

- 2007 – 4808 juveniles processed
- 2008 – 4529 juveniles processed
- 2009 – 4545 juveniles processed

Racial/Ethnic Patterns:

Curfew statistics for 2007 – 2009 have been reviewed to determine racial/ethnic patterns in curfew enforcement during this period. Overall, white youth (the Houston Municipal Courts does not have a separate category for Hispanic youth so they have been included in the white category) account for 6042 citations or 66.51% of all curfew citations issued during the 2007-2009 time period. African American youth account for 2980 citations (31.81%), and Asians youth for 81 citations (0.9%). “Other” classifications constitute less than one percent of all citations issued.

As has been done for previous curfew reviews, demographic data for the Houston Independent School District was examined, since this district has the largest student population in the city. HISD reflects an average 28.15% African American student population for this age group, while Hispanics make up 60.7%. White students account for 7.9% and Asians 3.2%. When comparing racial/ethnic breakdowns found in curfew enforcement figures, a generally proportional pattern is observed relative to enforcement and demographics.

Review of enforcement activity indicated that the ethnicity of juveniles cited for violation of the curfew ordinance closely paralleled the demographics of the Houston Independent School District, grades 4-12 to approximate the ages of 10-17. (See Table 1 and 2)

Legal Challenges

There have been no legal challenges to the City of Houston juvenile curfew ordinance. The Houston curfew ordinance was modeled after the Dallas. That city's ordinance was upheld in a ruling by the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals (*Qutb v. Strauss*), and allowed to stand by the United States Supreme Court.

An earlier ruling by the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals found that a juvenile curfew ordinance infringed on a minor's fundamental right to association. To justify a curfew in the Fifth Circuit, a significant state interest must be demonstrated. The most commonly cited state interests used in justifying juvenile curfews were (1) helping parents control their children, (2) protecting juveniles from criminal activity, (3) protecting juveniles from improper influences that may prevail during the curfew hours, and (4) protecting the public from the criminal acts of juveniles. The juvenile ordinance of the City of Houston was styled to address these interests.

Crime Reduction Factors

As stated in the 2004 Juvenile Curfew Review, criminologists and law enforcement professionals debate the reasons and factors involved in crime reduction. Both groups agree that a variety of factors working together account for a decrease in crime. Some of these factors include education, family values, religion, economic conditions, laws, curfew ordinances, police programs, corrections programs, and youth programs. All these factors are vital in decreasing adult and juvenile crimes.

Texas Local Government Code – Section 370.002.

§ 370.002. REVIEW OF JUVENILE CURFEW ORDER OR ORDINANCE.

(a) Before the third anniversary of the date of adoption of a juvenile curfew ordinance by a general-law municipality or a home-rule municipality or an order of a county commissioners court, and every third year thereafter, the governing body of the general-law municipality or home-rule municipality or the commissioners court of the county shall:

- (1) review the ordinance or order's effects on the community and on problems the ordinance or order was intended to remedy;
 - (2) conduct public hearings on the need to continue the ordinance or order; and
 - (3) abolish, continue, or modify the ordinance or order.
- (b) Failure to act in accordance with Subsections (a)(1)-(3) shall cause the ordinance or order to expire.

Added by Acts 1995, 74th Leg., ch. 262, § 96, eff. May 31, 1995.

Houston, Texas – Code of Ordinances

Chapter 28 – MISCELLANEOUS OFFENSES AND PROVISIONS

Article V. – Juvenile Curfews

Sec. 28-171. - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, unless the context of their usage clearly indicates another meaning:

Adult means an individual who has attained the age of 18.

Curfew hours means the period between the hours of 11:00 p.m. on any Sunday, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday and 6:00 a.m. of the following day, between the hours of 12:00 a.m. (midnight) and 6:00 a.m. on any Saturday or Sunday, or between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. on a Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday.

Emergency means an unforeseen combination of circumstances or the resulting state that calls for immediate action. The term shall include but not be limited to a fire, natural disaster, vehicular accident, or a serious medical condition of sudden onset.

Guardian means the person who, under a court order, is the guardian of the person of a minor or the public or private agency with whom a minor has been placed by a court.

Minor means any person under 17 years of age.

Parent means the natural mother or father or adoptive mother or father of a minor.

Public place means any place to which the public or a substantial group of the public has access and includes, but is not limited to, streets, highways, and the common areas of schools, hospitals, apartments, office buildings, transport facilities, restaurants, theaters, game rooms, shops and shopping centers.

Sec. 28-172. - Offenses.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any minor to knowingly remain, walk, run, stand, drive or ride about, in or upon any public place in the city during curfew hours.
- (b) It shall be unlawful for the parent or guardian having legal custody of a minor to knowingly allow or permit the minor to be in violation of the curfew imposed in section 28-172(a) of this Code.

- (c) Violations of this section shall be punishable as provided in section 1-6 of this Code.

Sec. 28-173. - Defenses.

It is a defense to prosecution under section 28-172 of this Code that:

- (1) The minor was accompanied by his or her parent or guardian;
- (2) The minor was accompanied by an adult designated by his or her parent or guardian;
- (3) The minor was on an errand made necessary by an emergency;
- (4) The minor was attending a school, religious, or government-sponsored activity or was traveling to or from a school, religious, or government-sponsored activity;
- (5) The minor was engaged in a lawful employment activity or was going directly to or coming directly from lawful employment;
- (6) The minor was on the sidewalk directly in front of the place where he or she resides;
- (7) The minor was on an errand directed by his or her parent or guardian;
- (8) The minor was in a motor vehicle involved in intrastate or interstate transportation;
- (9) The minor was engaged in, participating in, or traveling to or from any event, function or activity for which the application of section 28-172 of this Code would contravene his or her rights protected by the Texas or United States Constitution;
- (10) The minor was married or had been married or had disabilities of minority removed in accordance with chapter 31 of the Texas Family Code;
- (11) With respect to the hours between 9:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m., the offense occurred during the school summer vacation break period of the school in which the minor is enrolled or on a holiday observed by the closure of classes in the school in which the minor is enrolled or that the minor has graduated from high school or received a high school equivalency certificate;

- (12) With respect to the hours between 11:00 p.m. and 12:00 a.m. (midnight), the day following the offense is a holiday observed by the closure of classes in the school in which the minor is enrolled; or
- (13) The minor was attending or was traveling to or from a recreational activity supervised by adults and sponsored by the city, a civic organization, or another similar entity that takes responsibility for the minor.

Sec. 28-174. - Supplemental effect.

The provisions of this article are supplemental and shall be cumulative with all other laws and ordinances applicable in any manner to juveniles.

Sec. 28-175. - Enforcement.

Notwithstanding the penal effect of this article the chief of police is encouraged to develop alternative enforcement strategies, which may include but need not be limited to the return of minors to their residences or schools, counseling with minors and their parents or guardians, the issuance of warning citations to minors or their parents or guardians, or the referral of instances that appear to also involve the violation of school attendance laws to those officers who are responsible for the enforcement of those laws. The enforcement strategies shall be promulgated in writing to members of the police department so that this article may be enforced in a uniform manner.

AN ORDINANCE CONTINUING THE CITY'S JUVENILE CURFEW ORDINANCE; CONTAINING FINDINGS AND OTHER PROVISIONS RELATING TO THE FOREGOING SUBJECT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

* * * * *

WHEREAS, the City has a juvenile curfew ordinance that is codified as Article V of Chapter 28 of the Code of Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, Section 370.002 of the Texas Local Government Code, which became effective on May 31, 1995, requires that municipalities conduct review hearings at three year intervals with respect to their juvenile curfew ordinances, and the City Council last continued the juvenile curfew ordinance by adopting Ordinance 2007-563, including amendments thereto, on May 9, 2007, following a review and hearings conducted in 2007; and

WHEREAS, the City Council conducted hearings with respect to the need for continuance of the juvenile curfew ordinance on April 14 and April 21, 2010, and in connection with those hearings has reviewed the juvenile curfew ordinance's effects on the community and on problems the ordinance was intended to remedy; and

WHEREAS, based upon the hearings, the City Council is of the opinion that the juvenile curfew ordinance should be continued; **NOW, THEREFORE**,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HOUSTON, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the findings contained in the preamble of this Ordinance are determined to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as a part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. That the City's Juvenile Curfew Ordinance, which is codified as Article V of Chapter 28 of the Code of Ordinances, Houston, Texas, and was originally adopted as Ordinance 91-1543, and thereafter amended by Ordinance 2007-563, is hereby continued.

Section 3. That if any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance, or the application of same to any person or set of circumstances is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void or invalid, the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or their application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall not be affected thereby, it being the intent of the City Council in adopting this Ordinance that no portion hereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality, voidness or invalidity of any other portion hereof, and all provisions of this Ordinance are declared to be severable for that purpose.

Section 4. That there exists a public emergency requiring that this Ordinance be passed finally on the date of its introduction as requested in writing by the Mayor; therefore, this Ordinance shall be passed finally on such date and shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; however, in the event that the Mayor fails to sign this Ordinance within five days after its passage and adoption, it shall take effect in accordance with Article VI, Section 6, Houston City Charter.





RECOMMENDATION: (Summary)

Establish a public hearing date to consider adopting a Municipal Setting Designation (MSD) ordinance for Flex Tank Systems LLC for the site located at 16514 De Zavalla Road, Channelview, TX 77530.

Amount and Source of Funding: N/A

BACKGROUND: In 2003, the Texas Legislature authorized the creation of Municipal Setting Designations (MSDs), which would designate an area in which the use of contaminated groundwater is prohibited for use as potable water. The law is administered by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) and requires local City support to designate an MSD. Municipalities are given authority to support MSD's within their extraterritorial jurisdiction (ETJ) under the state law. The intent of the legislation is to encourage redevelopment of vacant or abandoned properties while protecting the public's health. On August 22, 2007, City Council approved an Ordinance amending Chapter 47 of the Code of Ordinances by adding Article XIII relating to groundwater, which provides a process to support or not support an MSD application to the State. This Ordinance requires a written public notice be mailed to property owners within 2,500 feet and owners/operators of potable water wells within 5 miles of a proposed MSD site. In addition, a public meeting and a public hearing are required to be held prior to City Council consideration of an ordinance of support.

FLEX TANK SYSTEMS, LLC APPLICATION: Flex Tank Systems, LLC is seeking an MSD for 6.76-acres of land located at 16514 De Zavalla Road, Channelview, TX 77530. The contamination consists of benzene, ethylbenzene, toluene, xylene, methyl tertiary butyl ether (MTBE), total petroleum hydrocarbons (TPH), and lead. The property was developed in 1981 as a bulk transport truck loading facility. From 1983 to 1994 Koch Refining Co. owned and operated an unleaded gasoline distribution facility. 




Municipal Settings Designation Application 2009-021-DZR Vicinity Map


2009-022-FCE Vicinity Map





SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The City Purchasing Agent recommends that City Council approve payment to RDI Mechanical, Inc. in the total amount of \$132,667.50 for emergency repair of a HVAC system for the General Services Department.

On August 17, 2009 the HVAC system at the Health and Human Services Department's Central Laboratory, located at 1115 S. Braeswood, was found to be inadequate and jeopardized the tuberculosis and other vaccines and test kits. The Federal Government's "Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments" require a maximum temperature of 77 degrees. If the temperature is above 77 degrees the laboratory must be shut down and testing discontinued. The Strategic Purchasing Division issued an emergency purchase order to address this emergency.

The scope of work required the contractor to provide all labor, permits, materials, equipment, supervision and transportation necessary to install duct work, grills, exhaust fans, pressurized controller, damper, actuators, drains and supports. The HVAC system repair has a one year complete warranty, including standard equipment warranties, and the life expectancy is ten years.

This recommendation is made pursuant to Chapter 252, Section 252.022 (a) (2) of the Texas Local Government Code for exempted procurements.



SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The Administration & Regulatory Affairs Department (ARA) recommends that Council authorize an ordinance approving Entergy Texas, Inc.'s (ETI) application to adopt a new rate consisting of a Rough Production Cost Equalization Adjustment (RPCEA) rider filed with the City of Houston on March 25, 2010. ETI (formerly Entergy Gulf States, Inc.) provides electric service to approximately 401,000 retail customers in Texas, including 1,383 customers in the Kingwood area — 1,105 residential and 278 commercial customers. The City of Houston exercises original jurisdiction over the rates, operations and services of ETI under the provisions of the Public Utility Regulatory Act (PURA) for customers within the city limits.

On March 25, 2010, ETI filed an Application for Authority to Implement a New RPCEA Rider with the City of Houston. The rider is designed to **credit** retail customer bills. The amount to be credited to retail customers over a four month period beginning May 2010 totals approximately \$117.5 million, including interest.

The RPCEA credit would affect ETI in-City customers within the Kingwood area. The effective date of the **rate decrease** is for bills rendered with the first billing cycle of the May 2010 billing month (which begins April 30, 2010) and terminates with the last billing cycle of the August 2010 billing month. The expected refund to the average residential customer using 1000kWh per month of electricity will be \$28.46 in May, \$21.44 in June, \$15.56 in July and \$16.07 in August.

ARA recommends that City Council authorize an ordinance approving the application of ETI for authority to implement the new RPCEA rate filed with the City of Houston on March 25, 2010.

SPECIFIC EXPLANATION:

The Administration & Regulatory Affairs Department (ARA) recommends that City Council adopt an ordinance relating to the retail electric rates of Entergy Texas, Inc. (ETI) within the city of Houston; denying the rate increase request and maintaining the current ETI rates in effect. ETI (formerly Entergy Gulf States, Inc.) provides electric service to approximately 401,000 customers in Texas. According to the utility, ETI serves approximately 1,383 customers in the Kingwood area — 1,105 residential and 278 commercial customers. The City of Houston exercises original jurisdiction over the rates, operations and services of ETI under the provisions of the Public Utility Regulatory Act (PURA) for customers within the city limits.

On December 30, 2009, ETI filed a Statement of Intent and Application for Authority to Change Rates and to Reconcile Fuel Costs ("Statement of Intent") with the City of Houston. According to the utility's filed Statement of Intent, ETI is requesting a revenue increase of \$198.7 million or 12.74% overall; however, after review of the rate filing and a reconciliation of the data, it was determined that the total requested revenue increase is \$210.5 million or 39.65%. While the change will impact all customer classes, 52.28% or \$140 million is allocated to the residential customer (see Exhibit A). If ETI's proposed rates were adopted, the monthly bill for the average residential customer using 1,000 kWh would increase by approximately \$25.87 a month.

On January 27, 2010, City Council approved Ordinance No. 2010-65 suspending the new rates for 90 days beyond the proposed February 3, 2010 effective date to May 4, 2010. During the suspension period, the City, in cooperation with several other cities within ETI's service area, engaged rate consultants to review ETI's rate case. The City also held a public meeting in Kingwood on March 23, 2010 to allow ratepayers the opportunity to voice quality of service concerns/ and objections to the proposed rate change.

Based on a review of ETI's Statement of Intent, the rate consultants determined that ETI failed to demonstrate cost increases or provide justification for any rate increase at this time.

ARA recommends that Council approve an ordinance: 1) denying ETI's rate increase request; 2) ordering ETI to reimburse all rate case expenses incurred on behalf of all ETI ratepayers within the city of Houston; and 3) maintaining the current ETI rates in effect.



The HFD withdraws our recommendation against the annexation of this area. This reversal in position is due to additional information that has come to light in the last couple of weeks.

- The recently constructed building was constructed with a sprinkler system that meets the City of Houston's requirements.
- Future construction is required to meet the building code.
- The consent language for annexing this land within the Northwood Municipal Utility District will include language that limits the use of the property to non-residential uses.





The contract is to provide for the continued implementation of an incentive rewards program for households participating in the Automated Curbside Recycling Program. Through a grant received from the Houston Galveston Area Council, RecycleRewards Inc. is already providing the incentive rewards program to 20,433 homes currently receiving Automated Curbside Recycling. RecycleRewards has offered to continue this current service to these pilot households through 12/31/2010 at no charge to the City of Houston. The proposed contract will allow immediate implementation of the RecycleRewards program to an additional 55,456 households that have received Automated Curbside Recycling beginning April 5, 2010. The City Purchasing Agent recommends that City Council approve an ordinance awarding a three-year contract, with two one-year options, to Keilers Holdings, Inc. d/b/a Cy-Fair Tire on its sole bid in an amount not to exceed \$1,201,618.00 for tire repair services for various departments. The City Purchasing Agent may terminate this contract at any time upon 30-days written notice to the contractor.

This project was advertised in accordance with the requirements of the State of Texas bid laws. Five prospective bidders downloaded this solicitation document from SPD's e-bidding website and one bid was received. The Strategic Purchasing Division conducted a thorough search for additional vendors who could possibly perform these services. As a result, 15 vendors were identified and notified of the Invitation to Bid (ITB). Subsequent to the receipt of the bid, vendors were contacted to determine the reason for the limited response to the ITB; potential respondents advised that this service was not in their scope of business or they did not have adequate staff to meet the scope of work requirements specified in the ITB. Keilers Holdings, Inc. d/b/a Cy-Fair Tire was the sole bidder. Although the Strategic Purchasing Division was unable to negotiate a lower price from the bid amount, Keilers Holdings, Inc. d/b/a Cy-Fair Tire is the incumbent Contractor who bid this new contract with minimum mark-up and/or no increase to its costs from the current contract rates.

The scope of work requires the contractor to provide all supervision, labor, materials, supplies, and transportation necessary to perform roadside tire repair services. This service includes the repair of flat tires, replacement of non-reparable tires and replacement of tubes and boots on a 24-hour, seven-day-per-week, on-call basis. The service area ranges from inside the City's 610 Loop to outside Beltway 8. Tire repairs include passenger cars, light-duty trucks and trailers, ambulances, heavy-duty vehicles, fire trucks and tractors.

The Houston Fire Department requests City Council approve and Ordinance authorizing the appropriation \$733,065.95 from the Equipment Acquisition Consolidated Fund (Fund 1800) for the purchase of capital equipment for the Houston Fire Department. The capital equipment is identified below. It is further requested that authorization be given for the issuance of purchase orders as necessary. Items will be purchased according to the terms of existing agreements or by bids according to procurement rules and are detailed as follows:

Confined Space Communications Center – This is a communications system allowing members of the Rescue Team who are actively engaged in accessing or extricating victims to talk with hands free capability in a high noise, confined, or otherwise harsh environment. Purchase also includes a probe that can be lowered into confined spaces to speak with victim until rescue can be achieved. Total cost is \$9,259.45.


Outboard Motors – This purchase request is for 1 - 90HP and 1 - 60HP outboard motors with propellers to replace units aging out of the fleet. These units will replace motors purchased in 1996 that have reached the end of their effective life span. The 90HP motor with a propeller costs \$6,525.99. The 60HP motor with a propeller costs \$5,269.99. Total outboard motor purchase through the State of Texas Cooperative Purchasing agreement, TXMas and is for a total of \$11,795.98.

Rescue Airbags and Struts - The X-struts and the lifting airbags are to complete the standardization of the equipment on all extrication ladder trucks. The X-struts allow for stabilization of vehicles that are on their sides and upside down. These struts allow for the EMS crews to enter these unstable environments sooner instead of having to wait on a rescue truck to arrive. This system is the same as what is carried on the rescue trucks so it allows for us to provide advance stabilization off what is already in place which reduces the overall extrication time. The lifting airbags allow for the Ladder trucks to lift heavy objects up to 26 tons with some limitations. It is usually time sensitive when victims are under heavy objects. This equipment allows for extrication of victims to begin prior to the rescue trucks arrival and allows for expansion of the operation once

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the rescue trucks arrive on the scene. This purchase from an existing agreement will outfit 12 Ladder Trucks, consistently equipping the fleet for a total cost of \$70,409.04.

Breathing Air Compressor for Val Jahnke Fire Training Academy - Some years ago the Breathing Air Compressor at VJFTA experienced catastrophic failure. Our contract Vendor at the time furnished a "loaner" unit pending replacement at no cost to the city. In 2009 this "loaner" unit also was deemed to be "out of service", and a spare trailer mounted breathing air compressor was put in its place. This spare unit was never intended for, or spec'd to provide the amount of service that it goes through at the VJFTA. This funding request is to replace the broken unit, and return the spare unit to its original intended role preventing failure of the Spare Unit as well. This item is will be purchased via the procurement bid process at a cost of \$31,025.00.

Self Contained Breathing Apparatus and one hour air bottles - This purchase consists of 124 replacement Air Packs in order to maintain Continuous Quality Improvement in our fleet of SCBA. These Air Packs will serve as replacements for broken SCBA and allow us to systematically begin recalling and upgrading our older SCBA to the point that they meet current NFPA Standards. 126 - 60 minute airbottles to be purchased are replacing bottles that have been damaged or reached their useful lifespan. 60 minute bottles are used as part of our highrise firefighting plan. They have a larger capacity than bottles for structural firefighting. SCBAs and airpacks will be purchased from the current COH vendor Orr Safety. Total expenditure for complete airpacks \$451,516.24 and total expenditure for 60 minute airbottles \$122,710.14 for a total appropriation of \$574,226.38.


Lincoln Welder with Trailer - Welder to be used on the Val Jahnke Training Facility Campus to construct and repair metal training props. This is a new purchase that comes with a 2 year warranty. This purchase will save time and money for VJTF by eliminating the need for a private contractor thus reducing the wait time and associated labor costs. Total cost of the unit is \$16,205.10.

Gear Lockers - This purchase consists of 17 wire frame mobile storage lockers for the storage of bunker gear for trainees at the Val Jahnke Fire Training Academy. Each mobile locker unit has three storage cells made of open frame construction to allow air circulation so gear airs out and dries efficiently. Trainees currently must store the gear in their personal vehicles. This is not terribly secure nor is it the best way to take care of bunker gear. The GearGrid Lockers are consistent with what is purchased for Station use and are easy to secure with a lock. This will help prevent bunker gear from being lost, misplaced or stolen. Lockers have a one-year warranty on parts and construction and a 20 year life expectancy. Total cost of this purchase is \$20,145.00.

PROJECT NOTICE/JUSTIFICATION: This project has been approved by the Federal Highway Administration and the Texas Transportation Commission for inclusion in the 1998-2000 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The project is currently listed in the 2008-2011 Transportation Improvement Program and is funded with Surface Transportation Program Metropolitan Mobility/Rehabilitation funds.

DESCRIPTION/SCOPE: This project consists of reconstructing and widening the existing two-lane asphaltic concrete roadway on Brittmoore Road from north edge of Old Katy Road to north of Hammerly Boulevard. The City of Houston (City) entered into an Agreement with TxDOT for this project under Ordinance No. 99-450 on May 12, 1999. Under the term of the Agreement, the City would manage the design of the project and TxDOT would manage the construction of the project. On December 14, 2005, the City and TxDOT agreed to enter into the Amendment One to the Agreement under Ordinance No. 2005-1354. 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
Recently, the City made a request to cancel the project on Brittmoore Road from Hammerly Boulevard to Clay Road and transfer the federal funds of the subject project to the Brittmoore Road, Old Katy Road to Hammerly project. On April 1, 2009, the Metropolitan Planning Organization passed Amendment Number 104 to the 2008-2011 Transportation Improvement Program, which increased the federal contribution up to \$12,504,000.00 for the construction of the project. In order to keep the allocation of federal funds in effect, the City is required to enter the Advance Funding Agreement by TxDOT. Under the terms of the agreement, the City is responsible for the design, advertisement, bid and award of the construction contract. TxDOT will be responsible for securing federal funds, auditing and construction oversight. TxDOT is currently requesting payment in the amount of \$9,000.00 for TxDOT construction management cost. Therefore, it is necessary to appropriate funds in the amount of \$10,000.00 which includes \$1,000.00 for City's salary recovery.





On September 26, 2001, Ordinance No. 2001-0880, Houston entered into Contract No. C53174 for professional engineering services with Bovay for design of the repair/replacement of various wastewater facilities for the Department of Public Works & Engineering.

Bovay claims that during the term of the contract, it provided additional construction management and design services for the project. Conversely, Houston alleges that Bovay made various design errors and omissions during the project (Claims). As a result of the Claims presented by both parties, a dispute has arisen between Houston and Bovay.

After a thorough review of the Claims and negotiations, both parties have agreed to settle the dispute for the amount of \$26,728.00, payable to Bovay.

The General Services Department recommends that City Council approve and authorize a CSA with Bovay and appropriate the sum of \$26,728.00 to settle the Claims.


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



P100203 Royal Oaks Civic Association Landuse and Boundary Map




