Our cadets are more diverse than ever before.

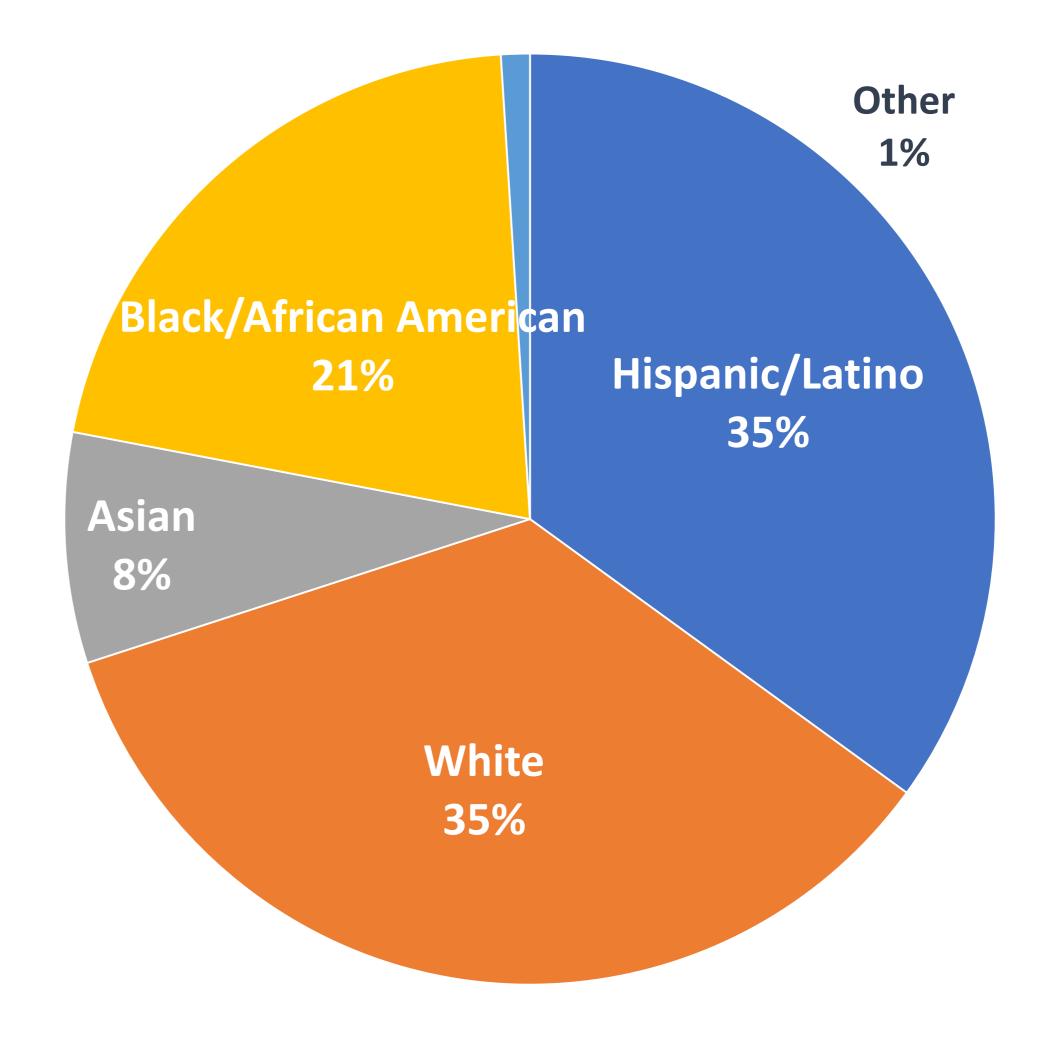

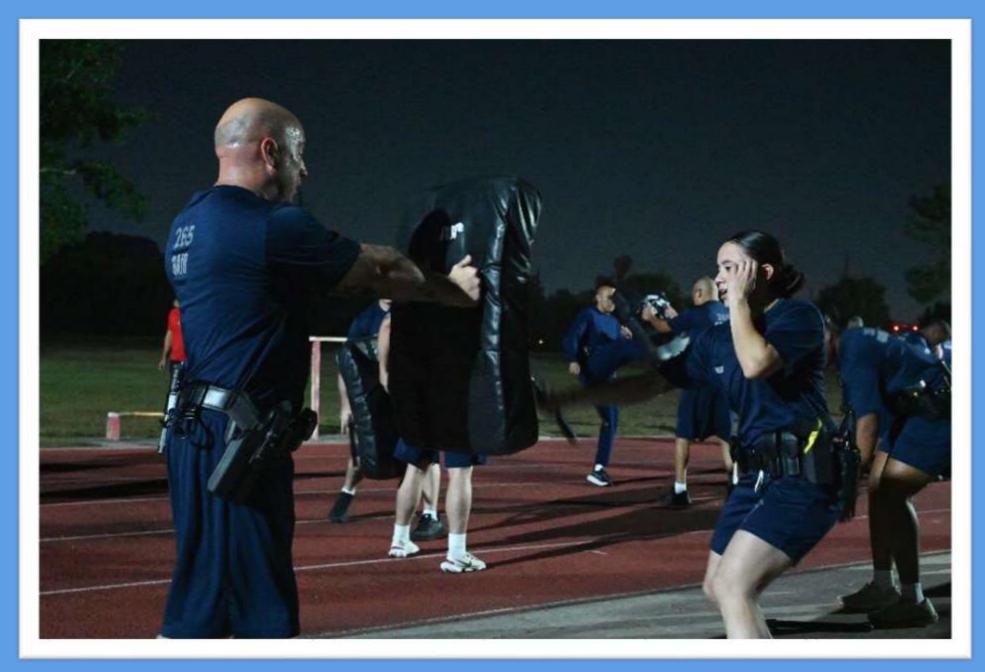

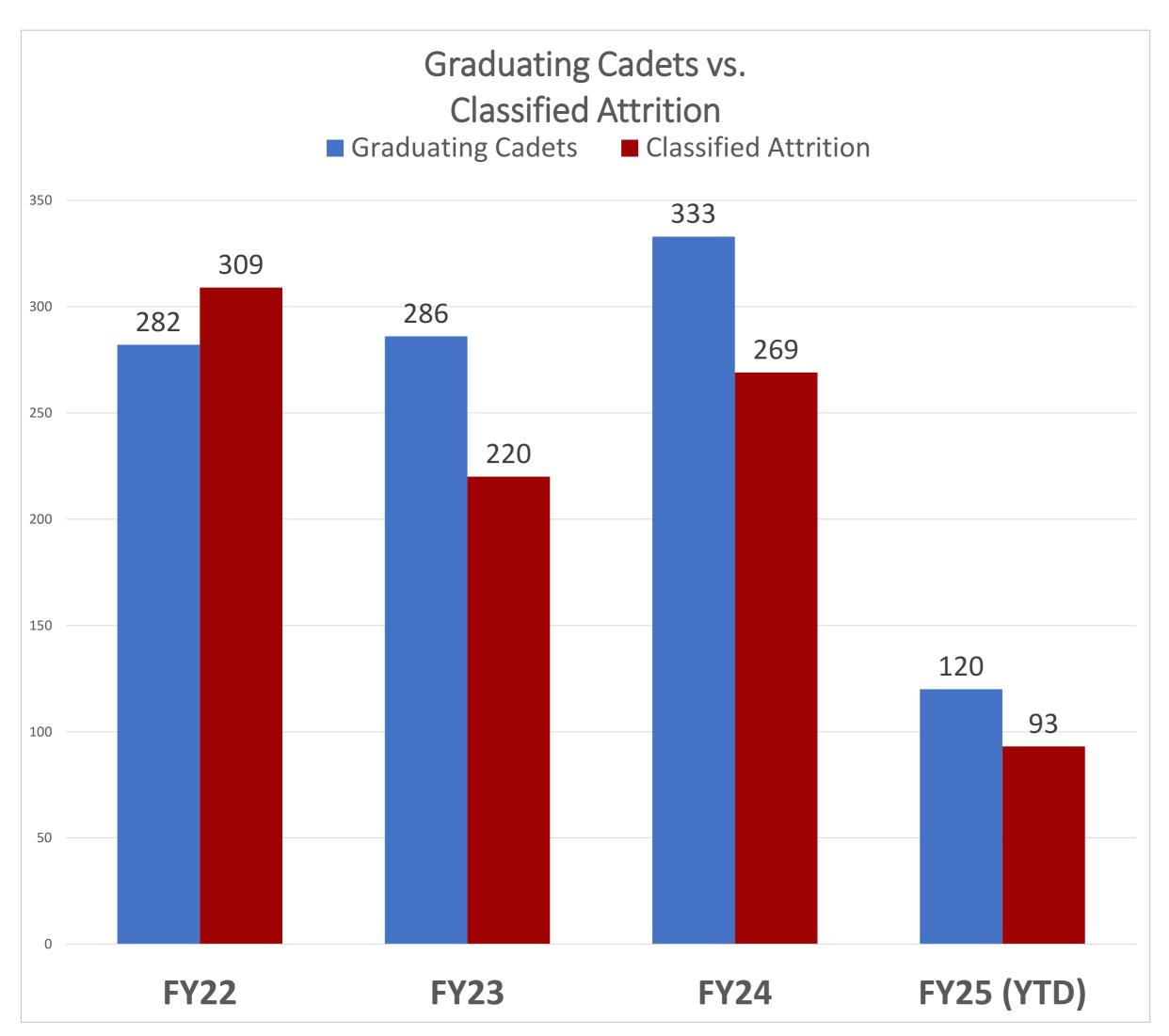

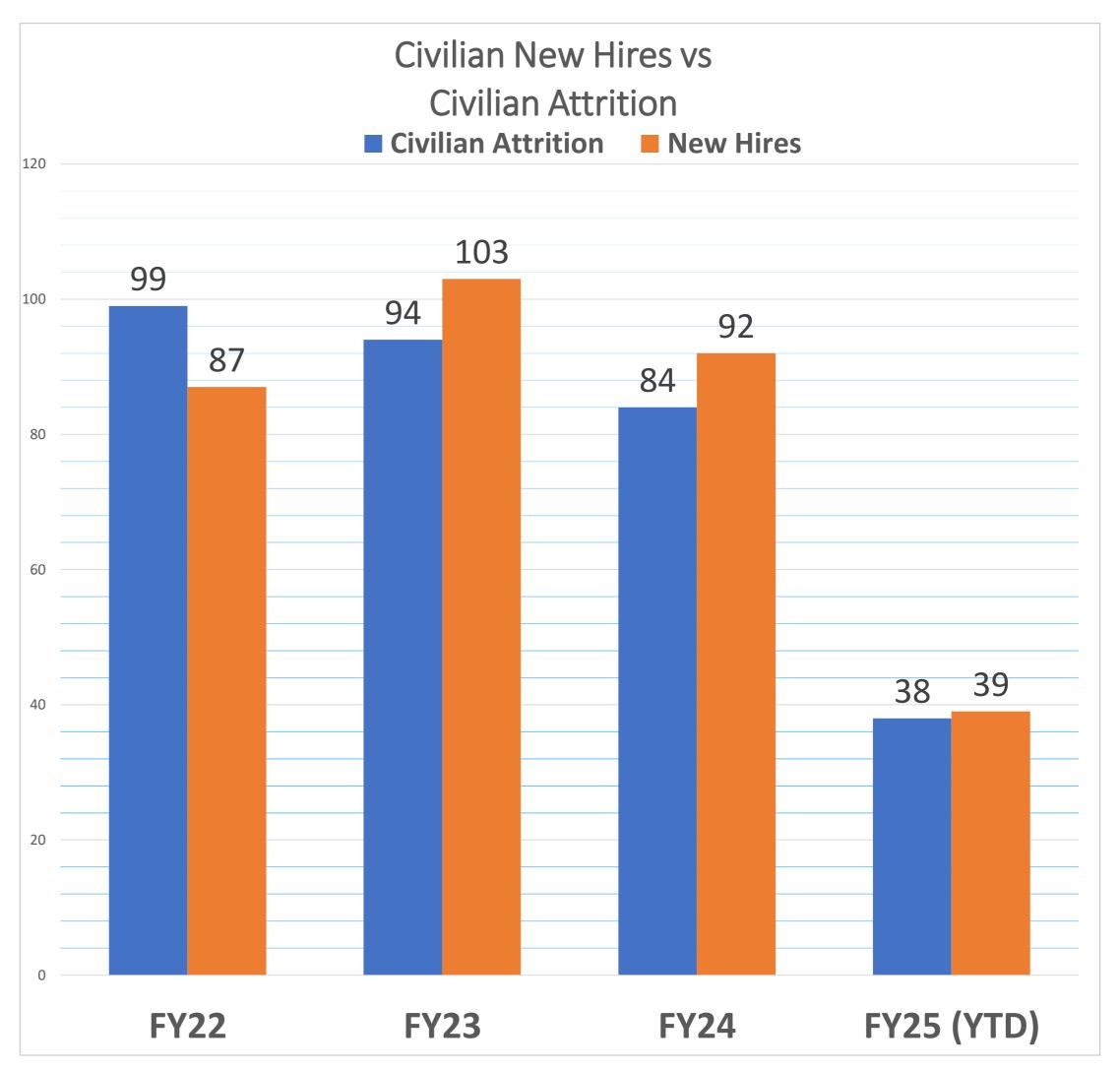

Classified & Civilian Attrition

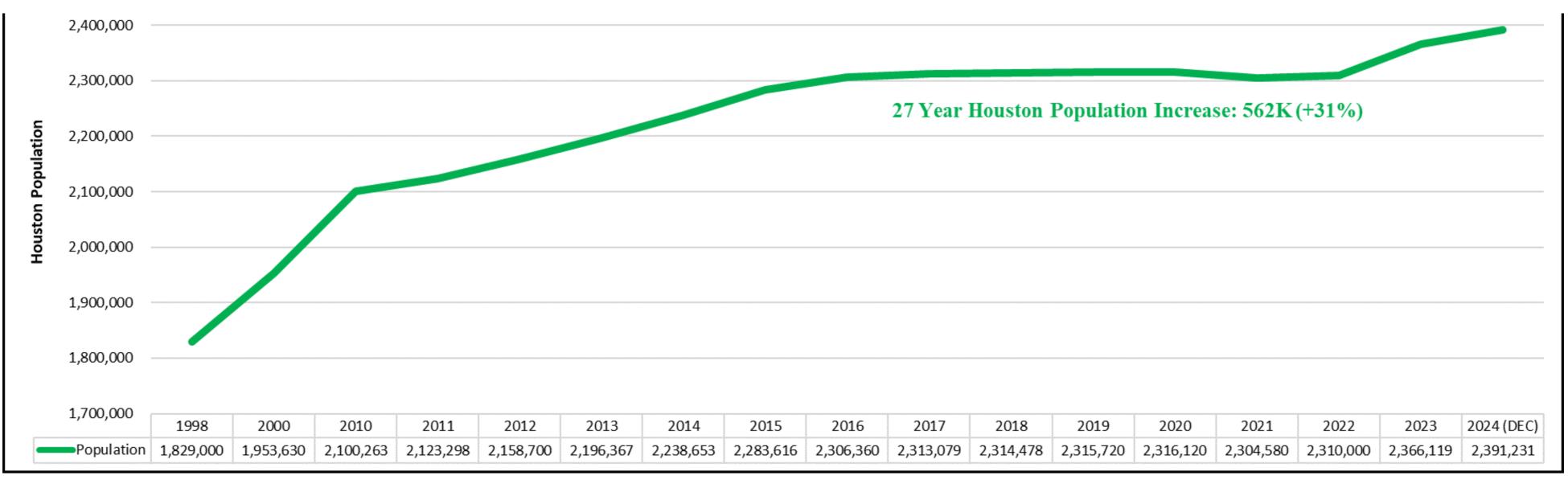


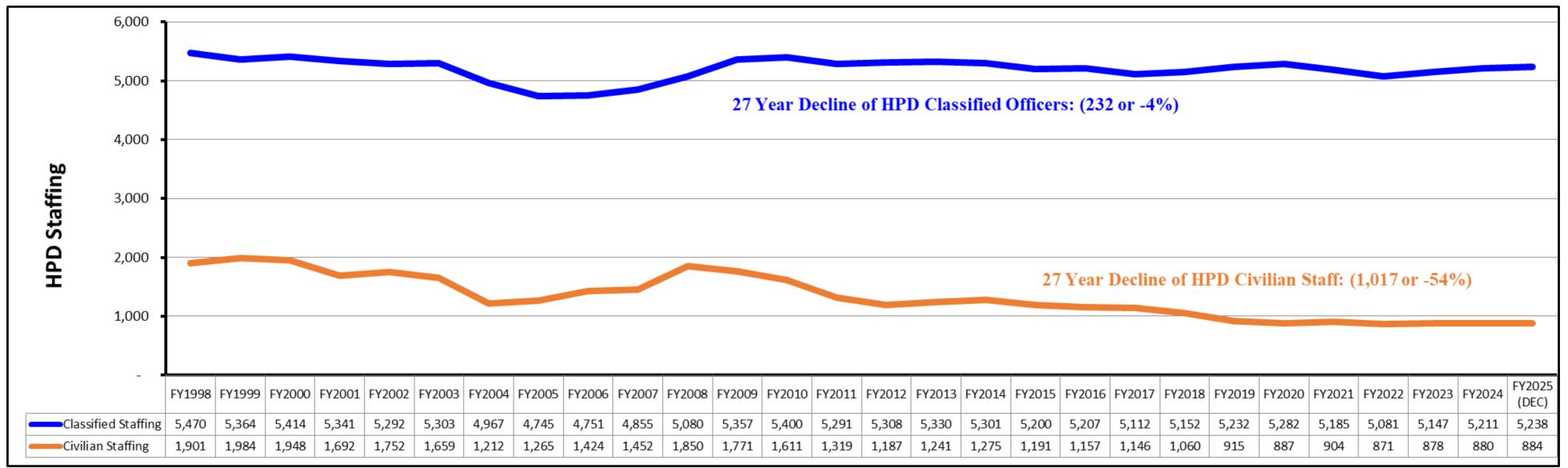




Population vs HPD Staffing

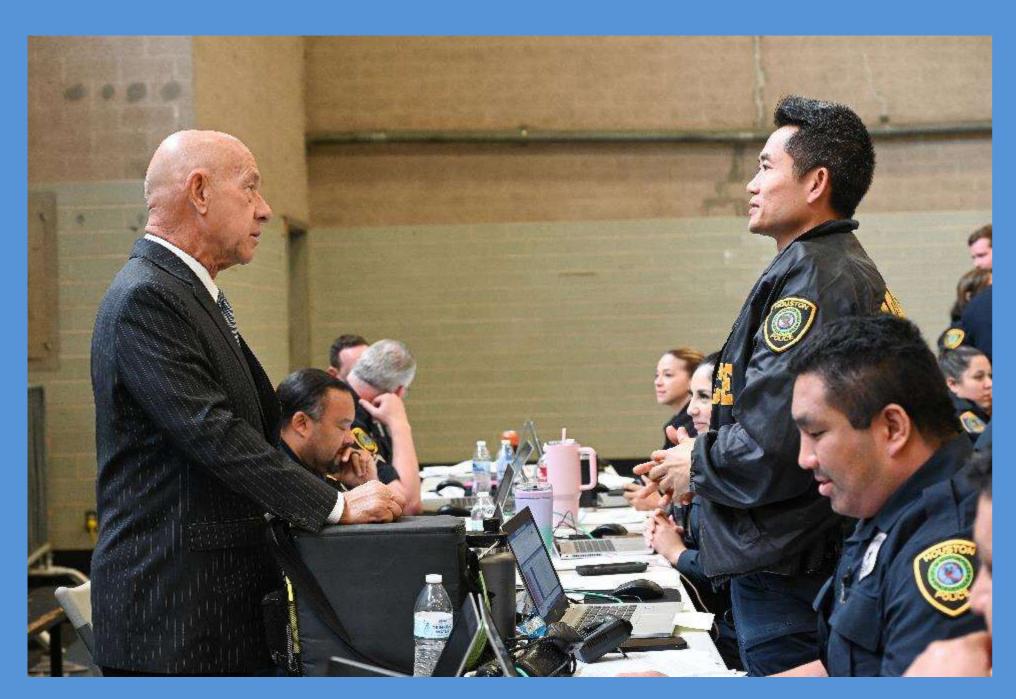
