

# WHAT IS TX-PACE?

- Local adoption economic development tool property assessment
- 100% long term, low cost private financing
- For energy efficiency, water conservation, distributed generation, and demand reduction (resiliency)
- On commercial, industrial, and multifamily (5+ units) properties
- PACE in a Box model program collaboration of 130 volunteers over 1.5 years, state-wide uniform best practices, local economic and environmental benefits for the City of Houston

# The Houston PACE Program

- Houston City Council established program in November 2015; program live August 2016
- Texas PACE Authority selected to administer the program at no cost to the City
  - Public Service Model
  - Approves projects on an objective, transparent basis using state-wide best practices for underwriting and technical standards
  - Education, outreach and training
  - > Funded by user fees and foundation grants
- > 2017: \$3.6 million in new Houston investment



# Investment in Texas: 700% increase


Statewide Year to year (2016-2017)




