Submittals and Scoring



- » There were four submittals
 - > AT&T
 - > Cogent
 - > Phonoscope Lightwave, Inc.
 - > Comcast Business Corporations, LLC was deemed non-responsive.
- » Pricing was weighted at 50 percent of the total evaluation
- » Phonoscope had the highest score

Recommendation



- » **We recommend “split award”**
 - > AT&T be awarded the contract for all Houston Public Library locations, where they are the incumbent
 - > Phonoscope Lightwave, Inc. for all non-Houston Public Library locations
 - > Cost avoidance will enable capacity expansion

- » **Costs:**
 - > \$10,480,000 for Phonoscope Services
 - > \$869,467 for AT&T Services
 - > Total 5 year costs \$11,349,467

SUMMARY & RECOMMENDATION



- To achieve important Technology and Business Objectives for the City, HITS recommends approval of an 18 month strategic purchasing agreement award for \$2.5M for GTSI.
- Sustain the current Council Approval threshold at \$300k to streamline standardized technology procurements and enable the City to maintain a more strategic position in managing technology initiatives, priorities and demands.
- Current Spending Authority ends April 2013 and HITS & SPD have implemented improved controls for IT purchasing using this procurement vehicle.
- Subject to E.O. 1-44 -> “visibility into all IT projects...citywide.”
- SPD will bring this item to the full City Council on **March 6, 2013**. The approval should cover 18 months of purchasing activities.

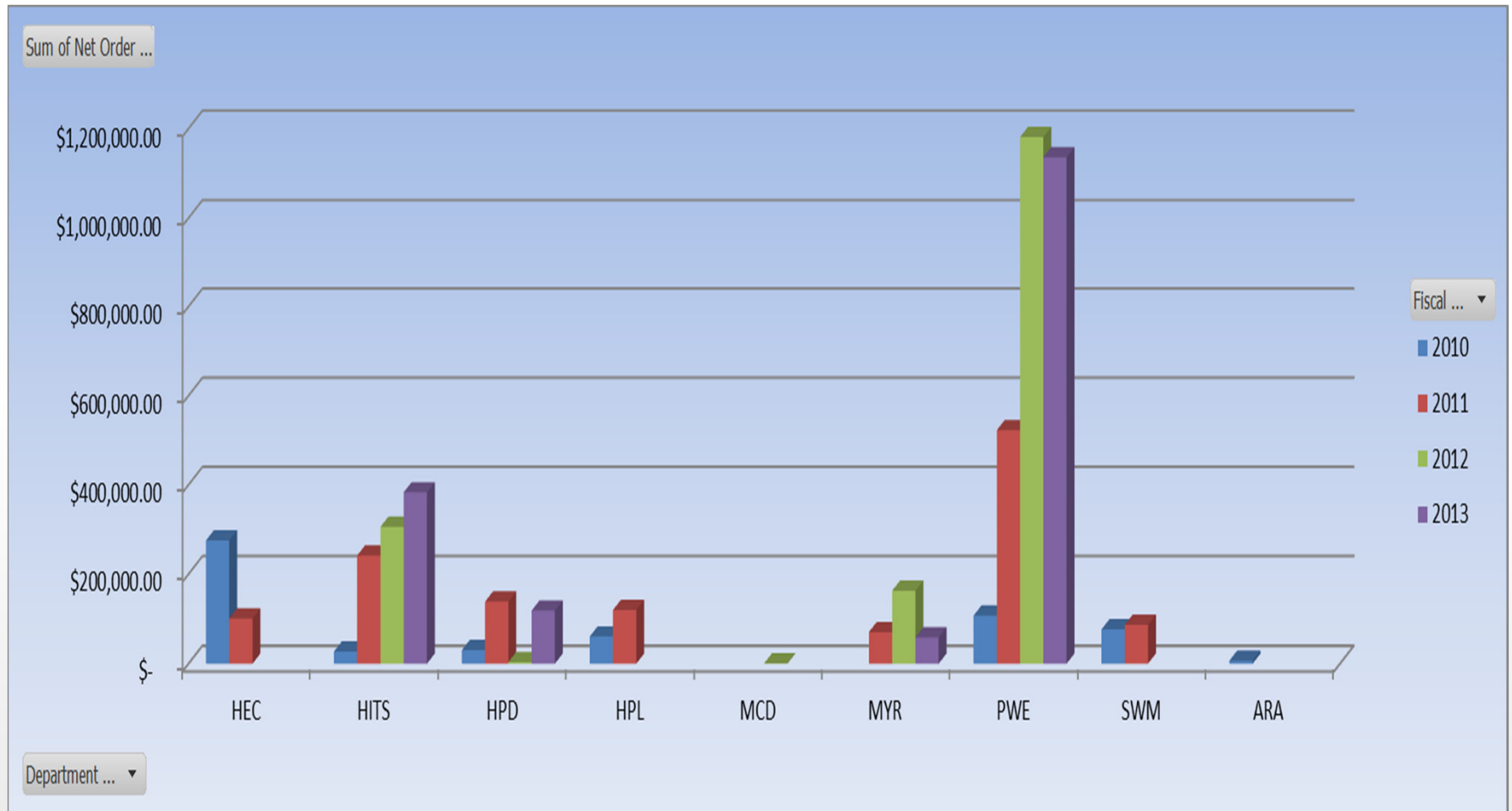

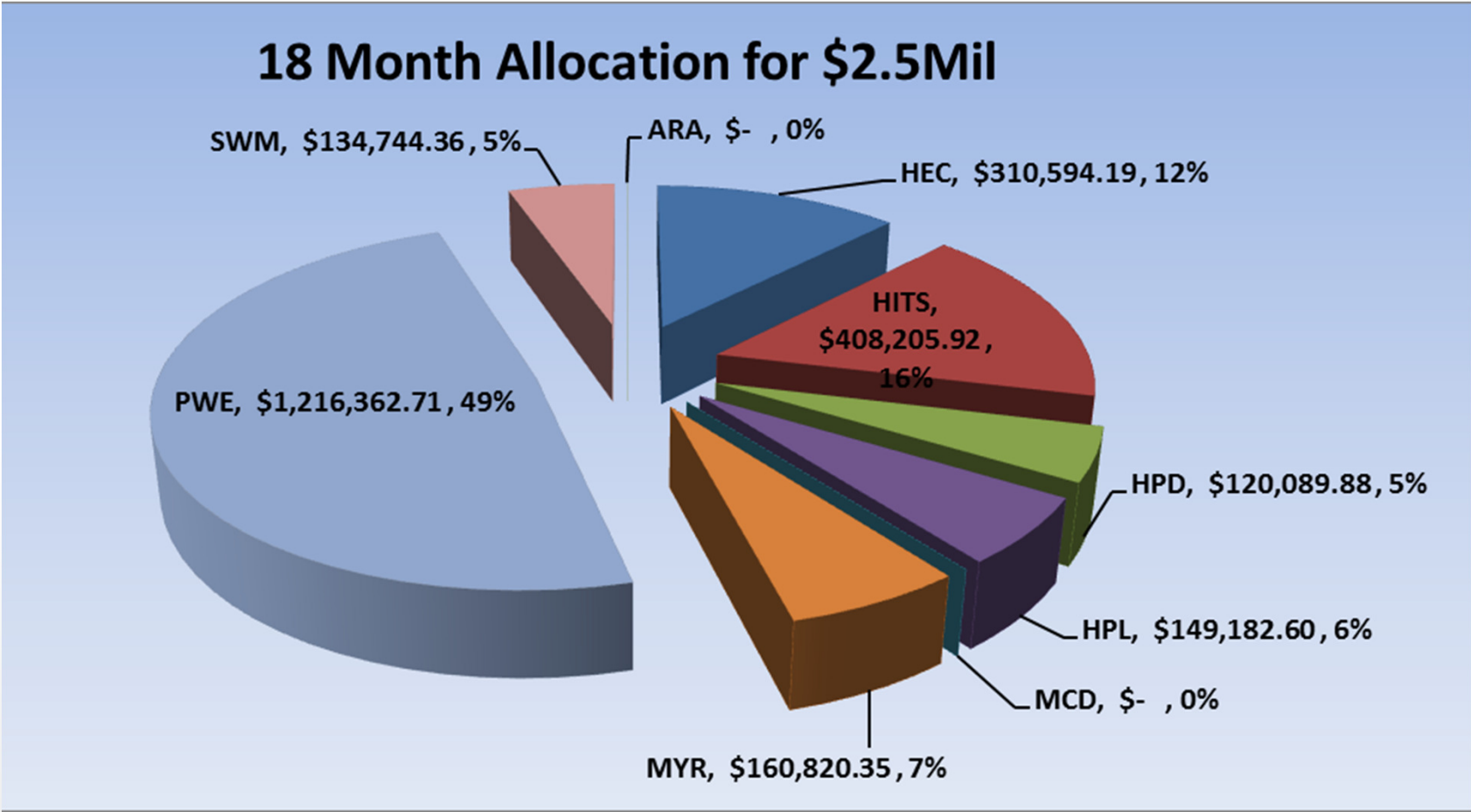


Previous GTSI Utilization Breakdown

M/WBE GOALS

- » **All purchases \$100,000 or greater are assessed in terms of divisibility of work and M/WBE capacity to the type of work to be performed.**
- » **The City assigns the M/WBE participation goal in the pre-procurement phase and will be referenced on each purchase order issued.**
