




Houston Permitting Center is home to six different city departments



BUILDING CODE ENFORCEMENT

- Permits Section Building permit application processing, address verification, iPermits/online support, ombudsman services
- Code Development Publishes code interpretations and guidelines; manage code amendments and ordinance changes; and reviews alternate methods
- Plan Review Commercial, Residential, and One-stop
- Inspections Mechanical/Elevators, Electrical, Plumbing, Structural, Occupancy, Habitability & Investigations, and Sign Administration





OFFICE OF THE CITY ENGINEER

- Traffic public and private reviews, TIA/traffic studies, encroachments, telecommunications, oil & gas pipeline permits, and monitoring wells
- Utilities water/wastewater review, water facilities review, easement dedication, street cuts, and paving permits
- Engineering Standards Infrastructure Design Manual, construction specifications, and GIS





STAFF AUGMENTATION

Isani Consultants – 6 structural plan analysts assisting with commercial plan reviews (contract started in April)

Bureau of Veritas – 30 expedited plan reviews are provided to customers each day (contract started May 9)

- First 3 weeks, only resubmitted projects allowed (including revisions and deferred submittals
- On June 13, first-time deferred submittals allowed as well as mastered projects
- By end of July, storm reviews will also be available using expedited plan reviews

iPERMITS IMPROVEMENTS

Some minor residential repair permits became available for purchase starting Monday, October 18, 2021.

500 permits have been purchased since implementation



OTHER IMPROVEMENTS (BUILDING CODE ENFORCEMENT)

- Reinstated flex schedule option (4 days/10 hours) allowing staff to work overtime on days off; this has resulted in an increase in overtime by staff and more plans being reviewed
- Automation of rejected plans on ProjectDox (no longer require an analyst or permit tech to process out)
- Building Code Enforcement (BCE) has reduced review times from 28 days in September 2021 to 17 days in June 2022
- Reducing reviews for deferred submittals and revisions to 10-12 days
- 68% of BCE plans are approved within first 2 cycles



FUTURE IMPROVEMENTS PLANNED

- Ensuring that plans are routed in 3-5 days
- Automation of resubmitted plans (will assist with above bullet)
- Automation of approved plans in ProjectDox
- Upgrading of ProjectDox to improved version (end of 2022)
- Implementation of a Customer Relationship Management System
- Microsoft Bookings for online service appointments

 - Coming Soon to Plan Review




REVIEW TIMES & SLA

The **Plan Review Diagrams** (bottom of the webpage) show the the oldest plan in review by Department/Section.




Our service level agreement (SLA) for commercial plans is 15 business days and 10 business days for residential plans.


